

Mandatory Skills/DoPs Guidance: 2025/26

The University of Leeds uses the PebblePad system across the whole institution. For the MBChB programme it is used to evidence students' completion of Workplace Based Assessments whilst on placement as well as their learning and development.

Each year of the programme have assessments that must be completed and evidenced in PebblePad by the end of the year. The types and number of assessments vary depending on the year group.

Mandatory Skills/DOPS

All students in years 1-5 of the MBChB Programme have a Mandatory skills/DOPS list. This is a list of various skills that they must complete/evidence that they have done whilst on placement. This list is reviewed each year and changes made where appropriate. Each skill has a short descriptor alongside it to outline what the student should be doing to complete that skill. All students have access to their mandatory skills list via PebblePad and PebblePocket so can share this with clinical supervisors.

You can also find the list of Mandatory Skills for each year group for this academic year (25/26) below. Please be aware that the list of skills/DOPS is different for each year group and that they are reviewed at the end of each academic year and may undergo changes/slight revisions. Please check you are using the up-to-date list for the academic year we are in and that you have the correct year group of the student/s you are assessing/supervising.

Mandatory skills/DOPS assessments must be completed on a Mandatory skills template. These templates can be found within the student's resources if using PebblePad or are available via the menu on PebblePocket.

If you are assessing a student, please ensure:

- All fields are completed fully
- That you provide the student with some constructive feedback
- That you sign and provide your details where indicated.

Please be aware that once an assessor signs a form it locks and can no longer be edited.

Often the student will open the template for you, this can be done on their phone using the PebblePocket app or via a laptop or desktop computer using their login to PebblePad.

Students are advised to complete assessments throughout the year (and to ensure they don't leave them all to the end). Some year groups have skills that require completing during certain ICUs/Placements (Y4), some year groups advise students to complete a set number of skills per placement (Y3 & Y5).

Non-Mandatory Skills

Please note, there are multiple other skills that students can choose to evidence should they wish/ have the opportunity to. Students can evidence these via a non-mandatory skills template.

Entrustability levels

Each skill has guidance on the minimum and maximum levels of entrustability we would expect the student to achieve at their current level of training (entrustability levels for skills do change as the student progresses through the 5 years of the programme to evidence progression).

The entrustability levels for each skill can be found on the Mandatory Skills Guidance document, all students should have access to this document for their year group via PebblePocket, so you can see this before completing the assessment. The entrustability levels can also be found in the skills tables below.

When selecting an entrustability level, you need to consider to what level you would trust the student to perform the skill/undertake the task the next time they performed it.

Students must meet the minimum level of entrustability for each of the mandatory skills by the end of the year. If on assessment of the student they don't meet the minimum level of entrustability for the skill you are assessing, please let the student know and provide feedback so the student can repeat this assessment later.

Entrustment Scale

OBS OBSERVE

No direct experience of the activity but can actively observe and participate (*e.g. accompanying a drugs round, working with practice nurse, sitting in a consultation*). Students learn about the clinical context, and apply safety principles and prior learning. Also applies where students are not permitted to undertake task (*e.g. completion of a death certificate*).

DIR DIRECT SUPERVISION

Students are relatively new to learning the task/process. Errors or lack of fluency are expected, so requires face-to-face supervision. Student brings knowledge and clinical context into discussion.

IDR INDIRECT SUPERVISION

Some experience with task/skill. Task initiated by supervisor, but indirect (*on the ward, next consulting room*) required, as errors may occur/student may require your help in completion. Student able to apply and reason knowledge and clinical context.

INIT INDEPENDENT PRACTICE

Can complete task, but at the request/initiation of supervisor. Student knows when/how to request assistance. Applies and reasons in clinical context.

TEA TEACH OTHERS

Can complete task independently, and task often initiated by student in discussion with supervisor. Able to teach elements of task/procedure to a junior student.

Mini-CEX

Students in Y3-5 also have a list of Mini-CEX they must complete whilst on placement. This list is available via PebblePad and is also in the student study guide, therefore is not included in this document.

If you are assessing a student on one of their Mini-CEX this needs to be completed on a Mini-CEX template which can be found in the resources section on PebblePad and on the PebblePocket app.

Case- Based Discussions (CBDs)

Some year groups may also have CBDs to complete, details of these can be found in their assessment study guide. Templates for these assessments are also available on PebblePad & PebblePocket.

End of Placement Forms

End of placement forms should be completed by the student's supervisor at the end of their placement; this should be done in person.

There is a template available for this on PebblePad and PebblePocket.

Again, please ensure all domains of the form are filled in before signing and locking the form.

Please be aware that some year groups may have additional tasks, logs etc they need to complete on PebblePad, these are listed in their year specific study guides.

History – Placement 1	DIR	IDR	Please evidence an opportunity that has arisen to practice supervised (adult) history-taking ideally in a clinical setting. Focus on the context Was this a cardiac/ respiratory/ gastro/ neuro/ vascular/ urology/ msk/ thyroid history? In your history, you should clarify the details of the presenting problem, and ask questions about any associated symptoms, past medical history, medications, family history and social aspects of the case. Also, include a systems review. Try presenting your history to a colleague or doctor. Interpretation of the findings – use the information to consider possible diagnosis. Consider if there were any barriers to you obtaining your history and how you could overcome these next time."

Intravenous Cannulation	OBS	DIR	Observe or perform under direct supervision the (with the patient's verbal consent) insertion of an IV cannula in accordance with local trust guidelines. Note the reason for insertion and the position and size of the cannula used.

Informed Consent	DIR	IDR	Under the supervision of a qualified healthcare professional gain consent from a patient for a procedure/skill you can undertake e.g. Venepuncture, cannulation, etc. Consider the procedure explanation, the intended benefits and associated risks, and the patient's perspective.
Intimate Examination	OBS	DIR	Observe (with the patient's verbal consent) a healthcare professional perform an intimate examination including breast, rectal and testicular examination. Consider appropriate chaperone use and appropriate documentation.
Intravenous Cannulation	DIR	IDR	Perform under direct supervision (with the patient's verbal consent) the insertion of an IV cannula in accordance with local trust protocol/guidelines. Note the reason for insertion and the position and size of the cannula used.
IV Antibiotics	DIR	DIR	Discuss a patient's IV antibiotic prescription with a doctor. What was the indication for antibiotics? What drug has been chosen and why (microbiology results?, empiric antibiotics based on likely pathogens, local guidelines etc)? What is the review process for IV antibiotics? What do you understand from the term antibiotic stewardship.
Moving & Handling	DIR	DIR	Using your moving and handling mandatory training knowledge assist with the transfer or moving of a patient. Ensure you use methods that avoid injury to patients, colleagues and self.
NEWS 2 Scoring System	IDR	INIT	Input observation data and calculate the NEWS 2 score using a NEWS 2 chart. Interpret the NEWS 2 score with a supervising healthcare professional in terms of action plan/escalation as determined by the result reference range.
Obtaining Swabs	DIR	IDR	Perform under the direct supervision of a healthcare professional (with the patient's verbal consent) obtaining swabs and/or instruct a patient how to take a swab. Demonstrate the correct technique to take a swab from the nose, throat, skin and wounds. Ensure the samples are placed in the correct containers and labelled correctly.
Otoscopy	DIR	IDR	Perform under supervision an otoscopy examination (with the patient's verbal consent).
Oxygen	DIR	DIR	Under the Direct supervision of a qualified healthcare professional administer oxygen therapy that has been prescribed to the patient, discuss the rationale for the prescription and subsequent monitoring that may be required.
Record Keeping	DIR	DIR	Make an entry into a patient record (E.g. medical notes) under supervision using the ISBAR handover format (link below). The healthcare professional will countersign/verify your notes.
Senior Escalation	DIR	DIR	Reflect with a member of the healthcare team on a case you observed where a junior doctor or member of nursing staff escalated a situation to a senior team member. Discuss the team-working and leadership skills involved in managing an acutely unwell patient, including the different processes for escalation.
Theatre Scrub	DIR	IDR	Demonstrate a theatre scrub using appropriate technique as per clinical guidelines in either a clinical or simulated environment. Please describe any specific aspects of "scrubbing up" that you recognise.
Urinary Catheterisation	OBS	DIR	Observe or perform under the direct supervision of a healthcare professional (with the patient's verbal consent) the insertion of a urinary catheter using an aseptic technique as per clinical guidelines for a female and a male patient in accordance with local trust protocol/guidelines. Note the reason for insertion and the catheter type.
Venepuncture	DIR	INIT	Perform venepuncture under the direct supervision of a qualified healthcare professional and in accordance with local trust protocol. Ensure you have the patient's verbal consent. Ensure correct selection of sample tubes and labelling of the blood samples at the patient's bedside.
Wound Closure	DIR	DIR	Observe or perform wound closure including suturing under the direct supervision of a healthcare professional in a clinical or simulated environment (with the patient's verbal consent). Ideally this should be completed during your surgical placement

Analgesics - Opioid Prescribing	DIR	DIR	CCC Prescribe regular and as required strong opioids for a patient with advanced disease and pain. Discuss your prescription with a doctor and ensure it is checked and signed by them. This MUST be completed during your CCC ICU.
Antenatal Assessment	IDR	INIT	GOSH Antenatal Assessment: Competently palpate pregnant abdomen to assess fetal lie, presentation, engagement, measure symphysis pubis-fundal height and plot on customised growth chart. Auscultate the fetal heart rate. This must be completed during your GOSH ICU.
Antibiotics	DIR	DIR	ACC Prescribe antibiotics under the direct supervision of a doctor or non medical prescriber for an adult patient in an acute setting. This MUST be completed by the end of your ACC placement but can be done in any earlier ICUs.
Arterial Blood Gas	IDR	IDR	ACC Perform (with the patient's verbal consent) an ABG in accordance with local trust guidelines from the radial or femoral artery and interpret the results in a clinical setting. This MUST be completed by the end of your ACC placement but can be done in any earlier ICUs.
Aseptic Technique	DIR	IDR	ACC Take part in a supervised procedure using an aseptic technique as per local trust guidelines in a clinical setting. Please note any specific aspects of maintaining asepsis that you follow. This MUST be completed by the end of your ACC placement but can be done in any earlier ICUs.
Bag Valve Mask Ventilation	IDR	INIT	ACC Competently use Bag Valve Mask ventilation. This skill MUST be completed during your ACC ICU and MUST be assessed by an anaesthetist.
Basic Life Support	INIT	INIT	PAEDS Through manikin simulation / teaching sessions, demonstrate you can proficiently perform Basic Life Support for a child as per the Resus Council UK algorithm. This MUST be completed during your Paeds ICU.
Bimanual Pelvic Examination	IDR	INIT	GOSH Perform a bimanual pelvic examination (with consent). This MUST be completed during your GOSH ICU.
Caesarean Section	OBS	OBS	GOSH Observe at least one caesarean section (elective or emergency). This MUST be completed during your GOSH ICU.

Discuss your prescription with a doctor and ensure it is checked and signed by them. This MUST be completed by the end of your CCC placement but can be done in any earlier ICUs
Gynae History	IDR	INIT	GOSH Obtain and present a gynaecological clinical history. This must be completed during your GOSH ICU.
Intravenous Cannulation	IDR	INIT	ACC Successfully insert (with the patient's consent) an IV cannula in accordance with local trust guidelines in an adult patient who is acutely unwell. This MUST be completed by the end of your ACC placement but can be done in any earlier ICUs
Laryngeal Mask Airway	DIR	DIR	ACC Correctly insert a supraglottic airway device (i.e. LMA, IGEL) in an adult. This must be completed during your ACC ICU and MUST be assessed by an anaesthetist
Local Anaesthetic Dose Calculation	DIR	DIR	ACC Calculate a safe local anaesthetic dose for an adult in a clinical context. This must be completed during your ACC ICU
Male Sexual Health History	IDR	INIT	GOSH Obtain and present a sexual health clinical history from a man. This must be completed during your GOSH ICU.
Management Plan Formulation - Psychiatry	IDR	INIT	PSYCH For a patient with mental illness, formulate the case using a biopsychosocial model. Present in an organised and coherent way to another professional. This must be completed during your Psych ICU.
